

PAR STUDIES UPDATE



From March until June 2024 Marija conducted fieldwork on social enterprises and social economy in Croatia. The study has had two parts: in-depth interviews with the practitioners of the social economy in Croatia and a two-day final collaborative workshop with the participants of the fieldwork and other interested parties and actors in the field of social economy in Zadar (June 15 – 16, 2024).









In 2025, building on the research of N-EXTLAW's previous AcET Interns Eman Pajic and Nicole San Jose, we will begin our study on Norway. This study will focus on collaborative housing and access to finance. We welcome any opportunities to connect over this project.

TRANSFORMING OWNERSHIP IN TIMES OF OVERLAPPING CRISES CONFERENCE

N-EXTLAW worked with colleagues from Utrecht University to organise an academic conference titled 'Transforming Ownership in Times of Overlapping Crises' taking place in Amsterdam on October 5-6, 2023. The goal of this event was to bring together academics, policymakers and practitioners of transformative practices from across Europe, to discuss some of the most pressing issues regarding the legal frameworks underpinning private property and corporate ownership structures.

Across two days, the conference hosted six panels and a roundtable. The conclusions of the conference led to the whitepaper 'Sustainable by Design – Industrial Policy for Long Term Competitiveness in the EU'.
